Proficiency in:

Setting up range

Familiarity with shooting distances, safety zones

Running range

Youth shoot – can you work with children?

Audible, clear commands

Watching for hazards and reacting appropriately

Giving feedback on safe practices, form (if desired)

Teaching a newcomer to the range

How to select equipment

How to follow the safety rules

How to begin shooting and continue with success

Inspecting equipment

Crossbow – ever seen and inspected one?

Horsebow? – differences in shooting style with thumbing (may shoot off “wrong” side of bow.)
